

Level 3 - Beginner - Join the literature-adventure!

Level 3 provides the well-known quality of BookR Class books for learners between 10 and 12: a variety of genres, accurate illustration and fun activities but a transition also takes place. There is a shift from simpler, shorter storylines to more complicated and extended texts with the unique linguistic features of storytelling. The topics and the style of the texts were produced in a way to fit the age group who is in transformation from children into young adolescents. This more complex and greater input enables the learners to further develop their comprehension skills but also demands greater concentration and more consciousness in the activities at the end of the books.

Jacob the Naughty Koala

Jacob is a small koala living his life the fullest. He is always having a great adventure. In this book learners get to know koalas: the parts of their body, their eating habits and lifestyle.

Focus of the games:

- reading comprehension: the description of koalas
- gap-filling with adverbs of frequency
- word search for vocabulary building

Idea: Ask your learners to create a chart of their daily routine. They can print the worksheet attached and label the parts of the koala as well.



The Fox and the Stork

One of Aesop's most well-known fables which teaches learners about the negative consequences of immoral behaviour therefore developing social skills and emotional intelligence.

Focus of the games

- character description with grouping
- reading comprehension with ordering
- communicative situational practice

Idea: What other problems could the fox and the stork have? How are their lives different? Ask your students to write a short comparison.

The Tortoise and the Hare

Aesop's fable on confidence, inequality and ingenuity generate many ideas. This story is a great way to highlight the morals of the story and also to teach about competition and personal qualities, individual differences.

Focus of the games

- comprehension check with sequencing the story
- focused grammar practice with simple sentences
- matching game with opposites

Idea: Ask your learners to create a cartoon about the race. Ask them to draw speech bubbles and to fill them with short sentences as well.



The World of Sport

We all know that sport is an essential part of everyday life so to encourage an active pastime, we created a poem to teach about some opportunities. The rhymes teaches the name of the sports and provides related vocabulary, as well.

Focus of the games

- labelling to learn about sport equipment
- matching activity with cues of sports
- gap-filling activity

Idea: let your learners create posters of their favourite sport including the related vocabulary.

Humpty Dumpty

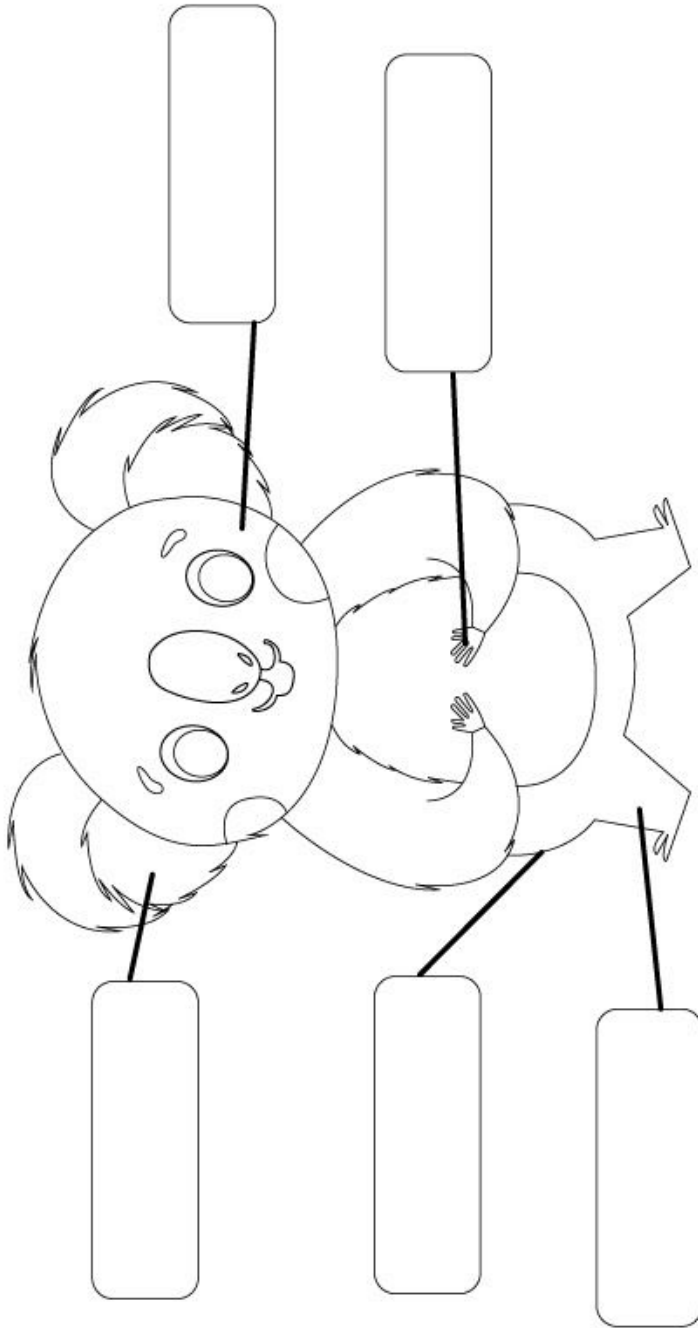

Focus of the games

- vocabulary building
- pronunciation practice with rhymes
- ordering the events of the nursery

Idea: As your learners create a choreography and teach it to their parents, brothers or sisters while singing the song.
