Along with these cultural overviews, some classics also appear on this level to provide authentic, original texts from the finest of literature.

### The Little Prince I.          Chapters 1-6

### The Little Prince II.          Chapters 7-14

#### Focus of the games

- discussion - What did the king mean in this sentence?

### The Little Prince III.          Chapters 15-27

#### Focus of the games

- reading comprehension - True or false?
- creating sentences by matching the subjects to the acts
- matching the present simple and past simple forms of verbs
